

5. Accreditation of previously passed study and training courses, further education and practical work

- 5.1 Previously passed study and training courses, further education and project work can be accredited as part of the M.A. in Responsible Management at Steinbeis University Berlin (SHB) Institute Corporate Responsibility Management (ICRM) according §3, Abs.4,5,6 SHB Rahmenprüfungsordnung.
- 5.2 Study and exam achievements, as well as university degrees which have been completed at the state or state-recognized universities or universities of cooperative education in Germany or at the state or state-recognized universities abroad are recognized, provided that the acquired competences are not significantly different from the achievements or degrees which are replaced. The approval serves for the continuation of the studies, passing exams, purposes of further studies and the access to doctoral studies.
- 5.3 The applicant is responsible for presenting the required information about the achievement to be accredited. The responsibility of proof that an application does not fulfill the requirements for the approval belongs the department that carries out the recognition procedure. The Examination Board of Steinbeis University Berlin, which is defined in § 2 General Examination Conditions (Rahmenprüfungsordnung, RPO), is in charge of the recognition procedure. The applicant shall be informed in written form about the decision.
- 5.4 Criteria for the recognition procedure, through which it should be approved that the acquired competences are not significantly different from the achievements or degrees which are replaced, are the evaluation of the following components of achievements:
 - 1. the learning objectives
 - overview of subject fields and grades
 - workload and ECTS credits
 - 4. practical applications (if applicable)
 - 5. other forms of performance evaluation
- Examination results from knowledge and skills acquired outside of higher education may be recognized within the scope of a particular case decision; given that equality regarding course content, course work (workload) and examinations of the previous program with the course subject of the present program has been established. These examinations can only be recognized once, and up to a half (maximum) of the credit points results can only be credited once. With the acceptance, it has to be en-sured that the same competence development, especially based on an equivalent project, is possible according to the project quality criteria. The Examination Board of Steinbeis University Berlin, which is defined in § 2 General Examination Conditions (Rahmenprüfungsordnung, RPO), is in charge of the recognition procedure. The applicant shall be informed in written form about the decision.
